Theme

Theme Caribbean guilder: World under the Sea

Fish swimming freely, seeing no borders reflects the metaphor for the unity shared between the counties Curação and Sint Maarten as part of the monetary union.

Introduction date: March 31, 2025



General Information

Denominations

The Caribbean guilder consists of 5 banknotes and 7 coins. The coins come in two sets, marked with "Curaçao" and "Sint Maarten", which are valid in both countries.

Banknotes:

Cg 10, Cg 20, Cg 50, Cg 100 and Cg 200

Coins:

1 c, 5 c, 10 c, 25 c, 50 c, Cg 1 and Cg 5

Currency code and symbol:

Currency code: XCG Currency symbol: Cg

Exchange rate:

1 ANG = 1 XCG 1 USD = 1.79 XCG

Important Dates

31 March 2025

The new Caribbean guilder enters circulation.

30 June 2025

Last date to make cash payments with ANG.

31 March 2026

Last date to exchange ANG at commercial banks.

31 March 2055

Last date to exchange ANG at CBCS.

Insights about the transition process

- From March 31 until June 30, 2025, you can make cash payments in both Caribbean guilders and Netherlands-Antillean guilders.
- Your bank deposits will automatically convert to XCG on April 1, 2025.
- ATMs will gradually be converted to Caribbean guilders as of March 31, 2025.
- Until March 31, 2026, you must go to your commercial bank to exchange Netherlands-Antillean guilders for Caribbean guilders.

- People without a bank account:
 - can exchange cash at the CBCS;
 - Up to NAf 2.500: one-time option offered for no need to make an appointment;
 - Amounts > NAf 2500: must schedule an appointment and proof of Source Of Funds (SOF) required. Instructions will be available on the CBCS's website.

General security features: Cg 10 Banknote





- Color is predominantly yellow
- The main characters on the front are the Gray Angelfish and the Queen Conch.
- The back of the note shows the historic Light House on Klein Curação.



General security features: Cg 20 Banknote





- Color is predominantly blue
- The front shows the Spotted Eagle Ray and the Yellow Cowry.
- The back gives a view of the ecologically unique Simpson Bay Lagoon.



General security features: Cg 50 Banknote





- Color is a predominantly green.
- The front shows the Green
 Sea Turtle and the Favored
 Tellin shell.
- The back shows the pristine Playa Kenepa Grandi Beach.



General security features: Cg 100 Banknote





- Color is a predominantly red.
- The front shows the Spotlight Parrot Fish and the Common Music Volute.
- The back shows the remarkable Courthouse of Sint Maarten.



General security features: Cg 100 Banknote





- Color is a predominantly purple.
- The main characters on the front are the Long snout Seahorse and the Giant Tun Shell.
- The back shows the iconic
 Queen Emma Bridge.



General security features

Orientation

Front: landscape Back: portrait

Dimension

All banknotes have the same size. Measurement: 147 x 66 mm

Serial number

All banknotes have a unique serial number

Signatures

All banknotes are signed by the President and the 'Directeur-Secretaris' of the CBCS

Date

The date of issue is stated on all banknotes. The date of the first series is '31 maart 2025'

Specific security features:



- Watermark
- See-through feature





Watermark



Look for the multi-tonal image of the compass - with arrow pointing North-East - combined with the letters XCG when held to the light.





See-through feature



See-through feature: Look for patterns on the front and reverse of the banknote that complete **the letters XCG** when held to the light.




- High-relief printing

High-relief printing






Feel the **raised ink** on front side of the banknote on:

- the sea creature
- CENTRALE BANK VAN
 CURAÇAO EN SINT MAARTEN
- signatures
- denomination



Elements for the visually impaired



Feel the **raised ink** along the short edges of the banknote, the number of rows corresponding to the denomination.

Specific security features:



- Motion Surface 3D moving stripe
- Rapid Detect Security Thread
- Spark Flow color-changing ink





MOTION SURFACE® - 3D moving stripe








Tilt the banknote to see XCG inside the sun shining over shell in ocean, and water droplets with strong 3D effect.

- Unique color per denomination
- Cannot be removed from the banknote



RAPID HD® Detect – Security Thread 3mm



See the rapidly moving waves.

Each denomination has a unique color.



SPARK Flow® - Color-changing ink



Tilt the banknote to see the **shell changing color** from blue to green.

The shells are specific to the denomination.

The denomination is pictured as part of the shell.



Iridescent ink



Iridescent color: Tilt the banknote to see wave motifs and XCG in golden metallic color.

Reverse

The orange blossom in the middle of a circle completed by either the word "Curaçao" or "Sint Maarten", connecting also the sea and the sky.

Obverse

The denomination sits between the Caribbean sky and waves in the middle of a circle of pearls connected by three Favorite Tellin Shells, leading to three groups of 10 pearls representing the date 10-10-10.

Color

All coins have a nickel / silver color

Dimension

Each denomination has a different measurement

Shape

All coins round, but different serrated edges



Cg 5 and the Cg 1-guilder coins

Reverse

The Curaçao coins show the island of Curaçao surrounded by the Caribbean Sea of which the waves are formed by the words 'Curaçao, while Sint Maarten coins show its national coat of arms. Both coins depict 2 Green Sea Turtles swimming to each other, representing the unity shared by these countries

Obverse

The obverse shows the effigy of the King, his name 'Willem-Alexander' and the words 'Koning der Nederlanden'.
